

## MARTHA'S VINEYARD, MA

### Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

The natural beauty of Martha's Vineyard beaches are world renowned and vary from the gentle, calm waters of the north and eastern area of the Island to the pounding rough surf along the southern portion. There are a number of beaches open to the public, while others are reserved for town residents (parking and/or beach permit is required). Property owners and summer renters can obtain beach and or parking permits through the local town hall with proof of residency.

A number of Land Bank & Trustees of the Reservation properties include access to beautiful conservation beaches. These locations often limit use by offering only a small number of parking spaces and may charge entrance fees.

These conservation agencies work individually and together to preserve the beauty and open space of Martha's Vineyard. Many of these lands are open to the public for enjoyment. Be sure to take time to explore the beauty of our conservation lands during your visit while observing the guidelines and rules.

The five lighthouses on the Island of Martha's Vineyard represent the most diverse group in a small, contained area in the country, according to lighthouse buffs. All of the lighthouses are on the north side of the Island: they look out over Vineyard Sound and Nantucket Sound, and over the entrance to Edgartown Harbor and Cape Poge. The Gay Head, East Chop, and Edgartown Lighthouses are maintained by the Martha's Vineyard Historical Society under a 30-year lease with the United States Coast Guard. All of the Island's lighthouses, except the Cape Poge Lighthouse, are easily accessible by road.

Marina and mooring services are available in the harbors at Edgartown, Menemsha, Oak Bluffs, and Vineyard Haven. Please contact the local harbormaster within each town, for additional information. The marinas' are conveniently located to each town, providing easy access to shops, restaurants and services.

## **Aquinnah (formerly known as Gay Head)**

### **Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses**

#### **The Gay Head Lighthouse**

Has always been extremely close to the ever-eroding cliffs. The red brick light was built in 1844 to replace a wooden tower authorized by President John Quincy Adams. In 1856, the Fresnel lens with its 1,009 prisms was installed, after having been exhibited at the World's Fair in Paris. It is now preserved at the Martha's Vineyard Historical Society in Edgartown, and is lighted every evening after dark throughout the year.

#### **Aquinnah Public Beach (Moshup Beach)**

4.7 acres, near Philbin Beach and Cliffs, off Moshup Trail. This beach faces the Atlantic Ocean and usually has fairly large waves. A ten minute walk from parking lot on cleared trail, paid parking only in summer. Open to public, no dogs allowed. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

#### **Lobsterville Beach**

2 miles of Vineyard Sound beach and dune stretch along Lobsterville Road. Open to public, no dogs allowed, limited parking permitted on Lobsterville Road, limited public parking and sticker parking at West Basin.

#### **Philbin Beach**

7.5 acres, this Atlantic Ocean beach is located off Moshup Trail. Seasonal permit required. Town beach, no dogs allowed, parking fee. Owned and managed by the Town of Aquinnah.

#### **Red Beach**

Beach is located on Menemsha Pond, so the waters are normally calm. Seasonal permit required. Owned and managed by Town of Aquinnah.

#### **Aquinnah Cliffs**

The Cliffs are a National Landmark and are seriously endangered by climbing on the cliffs and removal of clay (both prohibited by law). Please observe regulations, owned by the Wampanoag Tribe.

#### **Lobsterville Beach and Cranberry Lands**

230 acres, includes cranberry bogs, dunes and barrier beach. No public access to bird nesting areas, no dogs allowed. No driving on dunes or beaches. Limited parking permitted. Cranberry Lands owned by Wampanoag Tribe.

#### **MacDiarmid Land**

5 acres purchased for protection of the Cliffs. No beach access permitted. Pass through to Moshup Beach from parking lot



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# Chilmark and Menemsha

## Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

### Chilmark Pond Preserve

8.3 acres on the down-slope of Abel's Hill, the swimming beach faces the Atlantic Ocean (access to by canoe or kayak by the Chilmark Pond shoreline), offering a view of a remote Atlantic Ocean barrier beach. Neighboring areas of private property must be respected. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

### Great Rock Bight Reserve

28.5 acres includes hiking trails, and beach which faces the Vineyard Sound. Access off North Road, parking is limited and there is a lengthy hike over steep hillsides down to the beach. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

### Lucy Vincent Beach

2,390 feet of beach front, surf and bluffs facing the Atlantic Ocean with normally heavy surf. Seasonal permit required. Private property, leased to town of Chilmark.

### Menemsha Public Beach

16 acres, includes bathing and fishing, located next to Menemsha Harbor with its docks and jetties. This small beach fronts on Vineyard Sound and is adjacent to Dutcher Dock in Menemsha, a popular spot for viewing sunsets. Open to public, limited parking and lifeguard present in season.

### Squibnocket Beach

280 feet of beach front, facing the Atlantic Ocean with its normally heavy surf. Seasonal permit required. Private property, leased to town of Chilmark.

**Englander Woods:** 19 acres of woodland off Flanders Lane in Menemsha, currently no marked trails. Town owned.

### Fulling Mill Brook

46.6 acres include hiking trails through woods and meadow, along brook and rocky pools. Entrance located off of Middle Road and South Road. Owned by Town and Land Bank.

### Menemsha Hills

211 acres include hiking trails through the property to the Vineyard Sound, and panoramic view of the Elizabeth Islands. Public access off of North Road. Owned by the Trustees of Reservation.

### Middle Road Sanctuary

110 acres with parking area, bike rack and marked trails through the woods, access off Middle Road in Chilmark. Owned and managed by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation.

### Peaked Hill Reservation

93.4 acres surrounding Radar Hill (308 ft), Little Peaked Hill (300 ft), and the Island's highest point, Peaked Hill (311 ft). Wonderful views of the Atlantic Ocean, Squibnocket Pond and Vineyard Sound, including a sunset view over Aquinnah. Entrance is off Tabor House Road in Chilmark. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

#### Roth Woodland

26 acres of wetlands, headwaters of Mill Brook, and wildlife preserve. Access off North Road in Chilmark. Owned and managed by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation.

#### Waskosim's Rock Reservation

185 acres of rolling hills, meadows and diverse wetland. Panoramic view of the Island as far as Vineyard Haven. Marked trails, and open to public. Entrance on North Road, owned by Land Bank.

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## Edgartown and Chappaquiddick Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

### The Edgartown Lighthouse

Built in 1828, on a small man-made island in the Edgartown harbor. An Act of Congress allocated money to build it 1/4 mile from shore. Later, \$5,500 was appropriated to complete the project and Seth Vincent was paid \$80 for a right of way to the tower. For the first year, the only way to get to the light was by boat, but another \$2,500 was allocated to build a footbridge. The first structure was replaced in 1938. Although the new light was placed on the original site, sand had filled in the area between the island and the mainland, and the current Edgartown Lighthouse stands on shore.

### The Cape Poge Lighthouse

By far the Island's most remote lighthouse. Built in 1801 when an Act of Congress appropriated \$2,000 for it. A 4-acre site was purchased for \$36 from Marshal Jenkins, Martin Pease, and Joseph Huxboro. The original lighthouse was made of wood and had a small caretaker's cottage. By 1838, the building was destroyed by the ravaging sea and rebuilt farther inland. It lasted only 50 years before the sea again claimed it and it was rebuilt, with a change from reflector lamps to red and white revolving prisms. The sea would not be denied, and reclaimed the lighthouse in 1892. It was rebuilt as a 33-foot-tall tower that lasted only another 35 years.

The present white wooden structure was built in 1922, 55 feet high with a light visible for a distance of 12 miles. In 1985 it gained the distinction of being the first entire lighthouse to be moved by helicopter; in 1997 the lantern was again moved by helicopter for repairs. The lighthouse's present site is 300 feet from the ever-hungry sea.

### Chappy Point Beach

705 feet of beach with expansive harbor views, on the Chappaquiddick Road at the foot of the Chappy ferry slip. There can be swift tidal currents and the beach quickly drops off into deep water. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

### Edgartown Great Pond Beach

3.3 acres, this swimming beach is on the barrier beach separating Edgartown Great Pond from the Atlantic Ocean. All access is by boat only; the may be launched from Wilson's Boulevard at Turkeyland Cove Park and Edgartown Great Pond. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

### Edgartown South Beach and Norton Point

314 acres, includes a public beach, ideal for swimming. Off Road Vehicle access to Norton Point, vehicles must stay on established tracks to reduce erosion. Three miles of barrier beach on the south shore in Edgartown at the end of Katama Road. Surf on one side with protected salt pond (Katama Bay) on the other side. Managed by the town and, owned by Dukes County and State of Massachusetts.

### East Beach (Cape Poge Wildlife Refuge and Wasque Reservation)

516 acres, endangered shorebird breeding habitat and nesting sites. Swimming beach and fishing, no camping, over-sand vehicle stickers required. Located on Chappaquiddick, access from Dike Road to Dike Bridge, continue over Dike Bridge to Cape Poge gatehouse. Open to public, fee charged for non-members.



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## **Edgartown and Chappaquiddick (continued)**

### **Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses**

#### **Fuller Street Beach (Starbuck's Neck Park)**

At the end of Fuller Street near Lighthouse Beach in Edgartown. This small beach is fairly close to downtown Edgartown and fronts on Nantucket Sound. Open to the public, with very limited parking. Managed by the Town.

#### **Joseph Sylvia State Beach (and Bend in the Road Beach)**

Two miles of calm beach along Beach Road between Oak Bluffs and Edgartown. The Edgartown end of this beach is known as Bend-in-the-Road, this small beach fronts on Nantucket Sound. Edgartown has lifeguards in season, parking and is accessible by bicycle trail.

#### **Lighthouse Beach**

A harbor beach, only a short walk from downtown Edgartown and is on Edgartown harbor, adjacent to the Lighthouse, managed by the town of Edgartown.

#### **South Beach State Park**

This 1.25 mile long beach fronts on the Atlantic Ocean, so there is often fairly heavy surf. Lifeguards present in season. Located between Herring Creek Road and Katama Road, state owned, managed by the town of Edgartown.

#### **Brine's Pond Preserve**

44 acres, includes a freshwater pond, open fields, pine-oak-aspen forest, a wetlands system and trails on Chappaquiddick. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

#### **Caroline Tuthill Preserve**

154 acres extends from the Edgartown Triangle to the shore of Sengekontacket Pond. 1.6 mile trail through unspoiled pine-barrens, old cranberry bogs, coastal swamps, and salt marshes. Access off of Edgartown-Vineyard Haven Road. Owned and managed by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation.

**Chappy Five Corners Preserve:** 73 acres - consisting of a dense pine-oak forest surrounding wetlands on Chappaquiddick. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Ed Case Memorial Park:** Located at Jernegan's Pond, off West Tisbury Road, town owned.

#### **Felix Neck Wildlife Sanctuary (part of Mass Audubon Society)**

350 acres, includes miles of trails, waterfowl and turtle ponds. There are marked trails and nature programs for all ages throughout the year. Access off of Edgartown-Vineyard Haven Road on Felix Neck Drive.

**Protected Scenic Areas: Sweetened Water fields** – Edgartown-Vineyard Haven Road, Edgartown

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## Oak Bluffs

### Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

#### The East Chop Lighthouse

This lighthouse stands on the site of one of the first telegraph signals, set up in 1828. Signals from Nantucket were received here and relayed on to Woods Hole, Bonnedale, South Plymouth, Duxbury, Marshfield, and Dorchester Heights. A series of raised and lowered arms and flags conveyed news about cargos of ships arriving at Nantucket. The first ship to be announced in this way was The Mercury, bringing in treasures from Sumatra. Jonathan Grout, Jr. set up the system but operated it only six years. In the mid-1800s, Captain Silas Daggett built a privately owned lighthouse on East Chop.

In 1875, the U.S. government bought the lighthouse and its land for \$6,000 and the present cast-iron structure was built on the cliff 79 feet above the sea. Until 1988, when it was painted white, the East Chop Light was fondly called the Chocolate Lighthouse, for its brown-red color.

#### Eastville Point Beach

6 acres include fishing, on-site parking, harbor swimming beach, and park with a broad view of Vineyard Haven outer harbor and the channel into Lagoon Pond. The waves are normally small, especially by the drawbridge. Entrance at the drawbridge between Oak Bluffs and Vineyard Haven on Beach Road. Owned and managed by Dukes County.

#### Joseph Sylvia State Beach

56 acres of beachfront, continues into Edgartown, operated by the county. Open to public, free of charge, with parking adjacent to the beach. Popular beach for families because the waves are usually small. If it is windy and the waves are too large, there usually will be calm waters along the pond side. No vehicles permitted on beach. Owned by the state and maintained by Dukes County. The Edgartown end of this beach is known as Bend-in-the-Road Beach. Edgartown has lifeguards in season.

#### Little Joseph Sylvia State Beach

This small beach is on the barrier beach separating Farm Pond from Nantucket Sound, at the southern end of the seawall. The water is fairly shallow.

#### Marinelli Beach

This small beach is on the Nantucket Sound adjacent to the channel into Oak Bluffs Harbor. Limited parking available and access via a foot trail through the East Chop Beach Club property along the harbor. Owned and managed by the town.

#### Oak Bluffs Town Beach

4 acres of shoreline abutting Steamship Authority dock on Beach Road and 5 acres abutting the East Chop Beach Club across the Oak Bluffs harbor. Lifeguards present in season, open to public.

#### Sailing Camp Park

16 acres includes beach front park with lodge, fishing, swimming, and parking on-site. This beach is on the generally calm waters of Lagoon Pond. Located off Barnes Road, town owned and managed.



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## Oak Bluffs (continued)

### Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

**Flying Horses Carousel** located in the center of Oak Bluffs is the oldest continuously operating carousel in the country. Its horses were hand-carved in New York City in 1876. This historic landmark is maintained by the Martha's Vineyard Preservation Trust, and is open daily during the summer and on weekends in the spring and fall.

**Brine Woodlot:** 90 acres of woods off County Road, town owned and managed.

**Crystal Lake:** 18 acres of wildlife and bird refuge, owned by East Chop Association (off East Chop Drive).

**Farm Pond:** 27 acre preserve, accessible to marshland birding, a short walk from Oak Bluffs center. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Ocean Park:** Downtown municipal park, site of various community events, weekly band concerts in the summer, offering a vista of Nantucket Sound.

**Quay's Corner:** 0.5 acre near the MV Hospital, bike rack, benches, views of the Sound. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Sarson's Island:** A shore and sea bird nesting area in Sengekontacket Pond, excellent bird watching from Beach Road. Owned and managed by Felix Neck Wildlife Trust.

**Trade Wind Fields:** 72 acres, sandplain grassland just outside of the heart of Oak Bluffs that was used for many years as a grass strip airport. Located off of County Road. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Waban Park:** Downtown municipal park, weekly farmers' market in the summer, community events, kite flying and other sports.

**Wapatequa Woods:** 19.6 acre preserve, heavily forested, accessible through the Tisbury Meadow Preserve. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Washington Park:** A downtown municipal park and neighborhood playground, community events are scheduled here.

**Permanently Preserved Farmland:** Iron Hill Farm fields, 18 acres

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## VINEYARD HAVEN/TISBURY Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

### **The West Chop Lighthouse**

The Island's last manned light, was built in 1817, and in 1838 the wooden building was replaced by the present brick structure. It was moved back from the edge of the 60-foot-high bluff in 1848 and again in 1891. In recent times, the small caretaker's cottage at its foot has been occupied by Coast Guard personnel. Vineyard Haven's harbor has been recognized as a port of protection since 1645, and for 300 years it was one of the most important ports on the Atlantic coast. Originally called "Holmes Hole," it acquired the name Vineyard Haven in 1871.

**Hillman's Point Preserve:** The swimming beach is on a sandy spit projecting into the normally calm waters of Lake Tashmoo. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

### **Lake Tashmoo Town Beach (Herring Creek Beach)**

2.5 acres, small town beach at Tashmoo jetties, fronts on Vineyard Sound and the channel into Lake Tashmoo. Waves are normally small and the currents can be quite strong in the channel, lifeguard in season. Fishing and shell fishing with permit. Located at end of Herring Creek Road, a dirt road off of Daggett Avenue.

**Lake Street Beach:** This small beach is at the end of Lake Street next to the town docks near the southern end of Lake Tashmoo.

### **Owen Park Beach**

1.2 acre, hillside park overlooking harbor with a town beach and pier, located on the protected waters of Vineyard Haven Harbor, adjacent to the town dock. Close to downtown Vineyard Haven, off Main Street.

### **Tisbury Town Beach (Owen Little Way Town Beach)**

80 feet of shorefront, sand beach and swimming. This small beach is on the western shore of Vineyard Haven Outer Harbor at the end of Owen Little Way, adjacent to Vineyard Haven Yacht Club. Limited parking available.

### **Wilfred's Pond Reserve**

3.4 acres offering scenic view of both coastal pond and ocean front barrier beach. The swimming beach is on the usually calm waters of Vineyard Sound (not on the fresh-water coastal pond adjacent to the property). The beach is accessed via a short hiking trail from the parking spaces at the end of the road. Limited parking and access, visitors may have to be turned away. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Bare Hill Preserve:** 3.5 acres, owned by Land Bank

### **Brightwood Park**

Woodland path from Shellfish Hatchery leads to 9 acre nature preserve/sanctuary, trails circle ravine. Access via the Land Bank's Ramble Trail Preserve at the end of Weaver Lane on Hines Point. Owned by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation



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## VINEYARD HAVEN/TISBURY (continued)

### Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

**Carpenter Woods:** 8 acres abutting Mink Meadows Golf course, includes trails, limited parking, access via Bigelow Road. Town owned and managed.

**Cranberry Acres:** 22 acres of conservation land, walking trails around ponds and old cranberry bog. It's the home of the Wakeman Conservation Center. Owned and managed by Vineyard Open Land Foundation.

**Lagoon Bridge Park:** 5.6 acres south side of drawbridge, with native plants and walking paths, abuts town landing and boat ramp.

**Lake Street:** 5 acres upland woods, town's boat ramp, pier, and moorings at Lake Tashmoo.

**Ramble Trail:** 6 acres, property offers a birds-eye view of the entirety of the Lagoon Pond at its highest point, abuts Brightwood Park. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Ripley's Field:** 56.1 acres with a large open meadow and oak-pine woodland. Uses include birding, hiking, horseback riding, and picnicking. Entrance off Lambert's Cove Road. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

**Shellfish Hatchery:** Off Winyah Lane, headquarters of four town mariculture program (research and propagation). Limited parking, steep stairs to Lagoon and dock.

### Tashmoo Springs and Overlook

25 acres, includes a scenic overlook at State Road, woodland trails, outdoor amphitheater. Managed by Tisbury Water Department.

### Tisbury Meadow Preserve

83 acres includes paths for walking, biking, horseback riding as well as birding and picnicking. Entrance 0.4 miles past the Lake Tashmoo Overlook on State Road on the left. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

### War Veterans Memorial Park

10 acres with athletic fields, picnic areas, and playground. Access and parking off Lagoon Pond Road or Causeway Road, town owned and managed.

### West Chop Woods

90 acre nature preserve, includes hiking and horseback riding trails. Parking lot off Franklin Street, bike rack off Main Street. Owned by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation.

### Vineyard Haven Harbor

The Health Club at the Mansion House Hotel on the corner of Beach Road and Main Street allows mariners to use the facilities for a small fee.



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## WEST TISBURY

### Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

#### Lambert's Cove Beach

1,800-foot Vineyard Sound beach is restricted to town residents. Car stickers or walk-on passes are available at the West Tisbury town hall (mid-June thru Labor Day, although general public can use beach after 5pm). Limited parking, and access is off of Lambert's Cove Road. Owned and managed by the town of West Tisbury.

#### Long Point Wildlife Refuge Beach

633 acres of sandy outwash plain and woods, marsh, pond and barrier beach at Tisbury Great Pond. Swimming in Long Cove Pond and South Beach. Summer access via Waldron's Bottom Road, and winter access via Deep Bottom Road. Parking fee in the summer, beach passes and memberships to The Trustees of Reservations are available.

#### Sepiessa Point Reservation

164 acres, includes 1.4 miles of frontage on the Tisbury Great Pond and its Tiah's and Tississa Coves. Serene walking and horseback-riding trails and boat slide. Entrance on Tiah's Cove Road. Owned and managed by Land Bank.

#### Seth's Pond

This small beach is on the fresh-water Seth's Pond, and parking is extremely limited along the sides of Lambert's Cove Road.

#### Brandy Brow

1.6 acres, small hilltop park, junction of State and Edgartown-West Tisbury Roads, town owned.

#### Cedar Tree Neck Sanctuary

300 acres with trails through woods, beach, ponds, brooks, dunes and hilltop view. Bathing and picnicking prohibited. Located near the end of Indian Hill Road, sign posted. Long dirt road into sanctuary. Owned and managed by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation.

#### Child Farm

17.5 acres, owned by Land Bank

#### Christiantown

4.5 acres, includes a Memorial Garden, Mayhew Chapel, Indian burial ground, and historic marker. Owned by Wampanoag Tribe and maintained by the M.V. Garden Club. Access via Indian Hill Road to Christiantown Road.

#### Duarte's Pond

18 acres adjacent to 90 acres of Nature Conservancy land, owned and managed by Land Bank.



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## WEST TISBURY (continued) Beaches, Open Land and Lighthouses

### Hostelling International – Martha’s Vineyard

2 acres owned by Hostelling International – American Youth Hostels. Accommodations provided as well as educational programs and recreation. Located off of Edgartown-West Tisbury Road.

### Manuel F. Correllus State Forest

5,143 acres located mid-Island, 13 miles of paved bike trails, 33 miles of fire road and 5 miles of multiple use trails. Hunting permitted in season, off road vehicles prohibited, leashed dogs permitted. Parking areas are scattered around the perimeter of the forest. Headquarters located off Barnes Road in Edgartown.

### Mill Pond

3.6 acres, includes benches as well as a path at pond across from historic mill.

### Old County Arboretu

2.5 acres, triangle of open meadow opposite the West Tisbury School, adjacent to State Forest with bike trail. Limited parking, owned and managed by Land Bank.

### Polly Hill Arboretum

60 acres, property contains the results of Polly Hill’s 40 years of study to define “the best plants and trees to grow on the Vineyard.” More than 2,000 individual taxa, including azaleas, camellias, clematis, crabapples, dogwoods, hollies, magnolias, pines, rhododendrons and stewartia are now displayed around large meadows. Most of these have been grown from seed as part of Polly’s experiments to determine if growing zones can be extended, if growth is initiated with seed. Located at 809 State Road (less than 0.5 mile past new Agricultural Hall in West Tisbury).

### Priester’s Pond
